

Who owns the electricity utility in Malawi?

In Malawi, the electricity utility is publicly owned and vertically integrated, being dominated by the Electricity Supply Corporation of Malawi (ESCOM) Ltd.. ESCOM was established by an Act of Parliament in 1957 (revised 1963 and 1998), and in the year 2000, its total installed capacity was estimated at 304 MW.

Who owns power stations in Malawi?
