

What are the new grant schemes for solar energy in Malta?

The government of Malta launched six new grant schemes to incentivise the production, storage and use of renewable energy as part of the EUR9 million investment. The aid for solar energy will accommodate households with already existing systems to utilise battery powered systems and help new families setup the installation of new solar panel systems.

Does Malta offer a government rebate scheme for solar panels?

How much does a PV system cost?

PV with standard inverter - 50% of eligible costs, up to EUR2,500 per system (EUR625/kWp) PV with hybrid inverter - 50% of eligible costs, up to EUR3,000 per system (EUR750/kWp) Hybrid inverter + battery storage - 80% of battery costs, up to EUR7,200 (EUR720/kWh) + 80% of inverter costs, up to EUR1,800 (EUR450/kWp)

What is the new battery ready PV system installation scheme?

scheme New Battery Ready PV System Installation This scheme is available for those who opt to install a new solar panel system with hybrid inverter. By choosing this scheme the system will be suitable to the addition of a solar battery in the future and will be able to benefit from a grant of up to EUR3,000 and a 10c5 feed-in tariff.

How much is a feed-in tariff for a photovoltaic system?

A second scheme is also being re-issued, offering a beneficial feed-in tariff for photovoltaic systems under 40kWp. The feed-in tariff is set at EUR0.15 per kWh for 20 years and does not include a grant. The application process is now simpler due to automatic approval of the first part of the application process.
