

Power consumption of a mobile base station device

How do base stations affect mobile cellular network power consumption?

Base stations represent the main contributor to the energy consumption of a mobile cellular network. Since traffic load in mobile networks significantly varies during a working or weekend day, it is important to quantify the influence of these variations on the base station power consumption.

What is a base station power consumption model?

In recent years, many models for base station power consumption have been proposed in the literature. The work in [1] proposed a widely used power consumption model, which explicitly shows the linear relationship between the power transmitted by the BS and its consumed power.

What is the largest energy consumer in a base station?

The largest energy consumer in the BS is the power amplifier, which has a share of around 65% of the total energy consumption. Of the other base station elements, significant energy consumers are: air conditioning (17.5%), digital signal processing (10%) and AC/DC conversion elements (7.5%).

Is there a direct relationship between base station traffic load and power consumption?

The real data in terms of the power consumption and traffic load have been obtained from continuous measurements performed on a fully operated base station site. Measurements show the existence of a direct relationship between base station traffic load and power consumption.

How do you calculate energy consumption of a radio access network?

Hence for a Radio access network (RAN) made up of homogeneous base station sites, its total energy consumption, can be expressed as: $E_{\text{RAN}} = P_{\text{RAN}} \cdot T$. The figure of Merit known as the Energy Consumption Gain (ECG) can be defined as the ratio of the energy consumption of two systems or network.

Which base station elements consume the most energy?

Of the other base station elements, significant energy consumers are: air conditioning (17.5%), digital signal processing (10%) and AC/DC conversion elements (7.5%). New research aimed at reducing energy consumption in the cellular access networks can be viewed in terms of three levels: component, link and network.
