Which Romanian companies are adding Bess to their renewable assets?

What is the Romanian Energy Center?

The Romanian Energy Center (CRE) is a non-profit, non-governmental organization with the main objective to promote the active participation of Romanian state-owned and private companies in the Energy Market towards European partnerships, in European co-financed projects, and, most importantly, in the European decision-making process.

How much does Romania spend on energy storage?

Specifically, Romania allocated EUR 80 million (USD 87m) under its National Recovery and Resilience Plan for an energy storage programme expected to award 1.8 GW of capacity. Submitted projects as part of the scheme are being assessed and contracts are due to be signed in September.

Is the Bess market heating up in Romania?

The BESS market in Romania is heating up, say local analysts and insiders. Irene Mihai, policy officer at the Romanian Photovoltaic Industry Association (RPIA) recently told pv magazine that a realistic target for the utility-scale BESS segment in Romania "would be around 2 GWh (around 1 GW of installed capacity)" for 2030.

Is Romania a Bess market?

"As other European BESS markets become increasingly saturated, Romania stands out," said Evangelos Gazis, Aurora's head of Southeastern Europe, adding that the investment case for storage is strengthened by wind and solar's rapid expansion driving high volatility in wholesale and balancing markets.
