# What s in the base station container



## What is a station container?

Although the construction of a Station Container is much like that of other Cargo Containers a Station Container is far too big to fit in a ship's cargo hold and is only used for storage and inventory management at stations. Cargo containers allow for extra storage while either being deployed in space, inside a cargo hold, or inside a station.

### Can a station container be jettisoned?

Station containers can not be jettisonednor launched into space. Assembled, they are too large to fit inside any ship's cargohold, meaning they can only be used in stations for organizational purposes. They contain auditing functionality, which stores a log showing:

#### What is the difference between a station container and a warehouse container?

A station container is 10,000 m3 packaged, and 2,000,000 m3 assembled. A vault container is 50k m3 packaged, and 5 mil m3 assembled. A warehouse container is 100k m3 packaged, and 10 mil m3 assembled. Generally, these are built on-site at a station. But you could move a few of the small ones at a time in a pinch if you use a DST.

#### What is a container in Minecraft?

Containers (often referred to as cans) are in-game itemsthat can be assembled in the item hangar of a station or Upwell structure, placed in a ship's cargo hold or deployed in space as a way to store, share and sort items. There are five different container types that can be bought on the market, which differ in their functionality and purpose.

#### What is a cargo container?

Cargo containers allow for extra storagewhile either being deployed in space,inside a cargo hold,or inside a station. Community content is available under CC-BY-SA unless otherwise noted. This is a Station Container. It is fitted with a password-protected security lock and computerized inventory auditing.
